Warwick Sustainability Challenge Winners Announced!

Brought to the Warwick Community by the WIHEA ESD learning circle, Warwick Sustainability Challenge saw staff and students co-creating ideas to tackle a real environmental challenge in Coventry, using a more holistic approach to sustainability in HE. The Challenge engaged around 70 participants who actively participated in two 3-hour workshops, an optional drop-in session with experts in the area, and the competition initiative. After the workshops, the Challenge lasted for additional 10 days (two weeks in total). With the help of expert student and staff coaches, participants continued collaborating asynchronously and by the end of two weeks they submitted their ideas either in the form of an e-poster or a presentation, and a video.

The Judging Panel included: Bret Willers (Head of Climate Change and Sustainability at Coventry City Council), David Pipe (Senior Officer of Transport Strategy at Coventry City Council) Lee Griffin (Associate Professor in WMG) and Lorenzo Lotti (Associate Professor at UCL Institute for Sustainable Resources).
