

### [Transport](#)

A number of more sustainable transport options have been launched in recent months. You can start **earning rewards** for using either active or sustainable transport to, from and around the campus with the '[Choose your way Warwick app](#)'.

**Bus on Demand** – this Demand Response Transport service meets you wherever you are; it's a cross between a taxi and a bus. It operates in the areas surrounding the University including Kenilworth, Warwick Parkway, Leamington Spa and Wellesbourne campus. **E-Scooters** are available for staff, students and the local community. You can pick them up at designated locations and use them to travel around campus by [e-scooter](#). Staff and students can also apply for a 25% discount on the cost of rides or on a monthly pass.



**Tandem taxi service** - If you need to travel between Campus, Leamington and Wellesbourne campus, our tandem taxi service, which works like a [shared shuttle](#) is the best option. The service runs Monday - Sunday between 7.00am - 10.00pm and costs £3.00 each way. At peaks times journeys are available every 20 minutes.

### **City Nature Challenge**

Back in May, the University of Warwick and Coventry University took part in the City Nature Challenge for the first time ever, and we were thrilled to have twenty people get involved! The participants made 307 observations and identified 160 species, with the most observed being Garlic Mustard. The data will add to our knowledge of species present on campus. Bee orchids were also recorded and although they're not rare, they are a nice edition to the campus.

## Biodiversity projects on campus

A number of biodiversity projects have taken place on campus in recent months including:

A new **wildflower meadow** has been sown adjacent to Windmill Hill alongside the Spine Route from central campus to the Sports Hub. As the weather warms up more seeds will germinate although it won't be until next year that some of the seeds will germinate. In the years to come it should become a haven for wildlife on campus.



Gabions have been installed on the banks of Tocil Lakes. These are planted with **marginal plants**, which will grow and help restore the banks improving space for wildlife as well as opening up views for visitors. Grass has also been resown behind the gabions on compost produced onsite using our new eco-shredder.



The **Japanese Garden** at Gibbet Hill has been restored and now offers a wonderful space for peace, reflection and contemplation.

## Student Summer Interns

Three student interns will be joining the Energy and Sustainability Team from 28<sup>th</sup> June for six weeks. They will be working on:

- Engagement – continuing with regular communication over the summer and preparing for next term;
- Biodiversity – undertaking surveys on campus to help increase knowledge of species present; and
- Scope 3 and carbon accounting – researching the carbon impact of various activities.

### **UK receives grim warnings following report from the independent Climate Change Committee**

Government advisors have provided grim warnings following a report by the independent Climate Change Committee, which predicts warming will hit the UK harder than first thought. It warns of more severe heatwaves, especially in big cities, and more intense rainfall, with an increased flood risk across most of the UK.
