RAWKUS

On 7th and 8th September, Volunteers came together to support the final collection of the year from Post Grad Halls of Residence. We collected **2 tonnes** of food surplus and other items.

FSC vs. recycled paper

Warwick Print has recently carried out extensive research using FSC and recycled papers in printers. They found that devices developed consistent paper jam issues when recycled paper was used, which resulted in losses in operational efficiency, increased device downtime and Engineer callouts as well as wasted paper. We believe that FSC paper provides a better environmental and financial whole life cost than recycled paper and we will continue to assess this.

The decision has been made that **FSC paper should be sourced for all printers**. Warwick Print, Procurement and Office Depot have sourced 'Discovery 75Gsm A4 FSC Paper' (product ref: 6718005), which is provided in boxes containing 2,500 sheets with no additional packaging.



Paper savings

The central print room and departmental printers used under the Managed Print Service report regularly on environmental savings. Since the service was initiated and monitored a total of 7,670,000 sheets of paper have been saved by not automatically being released for print, which is equivalent to 211,743kg of CO₂, 76,719m³ of H₂O or 460 trees.

Spine route wildflower grassland

[CHANGE Festival](#) arrives at Warwick Arts Centre in Coventry 18 – 20 October 2019. This new event, quite unlike any other, brings together world-class shows, talks, comedy and workshops - with the aim to inspire visitors to imagine a better, more positive future for all.

The festival gathers performers, speakers and audiences from the West Midlands and beyond to imagine, play and explore. There will be some familiar faces and new performances enjoy, with over 20 inspirational events to choose from - because we all deserve to feel hopeful about the future.


We are also looking for **Cut the Flow Ambassadors** to support the Assistants within your accommodation. The training will take place on the 16th October.
