The Laboratory Efficiency Assessment Framework (LEAF) achievements

A typical laboratory will consume much more energy per m² than academic spaces. As such the University took part in the LEAF initiative for the first time in 2019/20. LEAF provides a systematic approach to help improve sustainability and efficiency in laboratories. The following labs achieved awards:

Silver awards:

- Computing Advanced Microscopy Development Unit (CADMU), Medical School
- Perrier Laboratory, Chemistry department

Bronze awards:

- WPH Proteomics Facility RTP
- Crop Centre, School of Life Sciences, Wellesbourne campus
- Genomics Facility, School of Life Sciences Gibbet Hill Campus



Developed at University College London, LEAF allows laboratories to work towards a defined standard, Bronze, Silver or Gold levels, similar in concept to the [Athena-Swan programme](#). LEAF contains criteria which lab users can implement around areas such as waste and recycling, equipment management and procurement. For example making sure fridges and freezers don't run colder than needed and are routinely defrosted. LEAF addresses reproducibility and research quality as key efficiency targets, in recognition that reproducible science is sustainable science.

SocsMark achievements
