

IMPACT OF UNIVERSITY SPENDING

The University of Warwick's physical footprint **supports jobs** and **promotes economic growth** throughout the West Midlands, and the UK economy as a whole.

In 2019-20, our spending contributed **£735m to the UK** economy and **£477m to our regional** economy. Our procurement contributed **£80m to Coventry and Warwickshire***.

The **University procurement expenditure** in 2019-20. **42%** of this was paid to suppliers domiciled in **West Midlands (£117.2m)** and **58%** to suppliers in **other UK regions (£164.9m)**.



£80m*

The **Coventry and Warwickshire** area** accounted for **£80m (28%) of procurement** in 2019-20. **12%** of the aggregate procurement spend was received by suppliers located in **North Warwickshire (£35m)**, and approximately **11%** to suppliers in **Coventry (£30.3m)**. Approximately **6%** was paid to suppliers in **Solihull (£15.9m)** and **4%** in **Birmingham (£12.6m)**.
