Prior to session

- Sign up to the sessions you would like to lead
- Read through Volunteer Briefing, Project Confirmation and risk assessment
- Check the online sign up
- Check weather forecast (if applicable)

On the day

- Print out the register
- Take key information (Volunteer Briefing, Project Confirmation and risk assessment and register)
- Collect equipment, resources and snacks
- Meet volunteers: you can meet the volunteers wearing a WV hoodie
- Ask volunteers to sign the register and save to shared folder after the session
- Read key points in Volunteer Briefing (schedule, key health and safety info)
- Depending on size of the group you could get volunteers to introduce themselves
- Introduce yourself and the community partner and find out what the tasks are for the day
- Take photos of volunteers (check volunteers are happy for their photo to be taken and put on social media)
- Supervise volunteers with support of community partners
- Ensure activity keeps to the schedule and volunteers are back on campus on time
- After the activity give feedback about the session to your Project Leaders
- Uploading a list of active volunteers and emailing them to thank them.

Session leaders are expected to help lead around 3 sessions per term. Volunteer days are usually held on Wednesdays and Saturdays. There is flexibility to hold sessions on different days and times.
