

## Exercise 111

1. After they had released the prisoners, the Athenians made peace.
2. Whilst being pursued by the Athenians, the Persians flee to the sea.
3. Since he had been hindered by the river, the general ordered us to make a camp.
4. Those who are going to release us are not hounding.
5. We pity those who have been defeated in the battle.
6. Those who had been defeated went back home.
7. After he was made general, Miltiades defeated the Persians.
8. After they had made plans for a long time (literally 'much') the generals ordered the army to go forwards.
9. We will save those who have been enslaved.
10. The ship which had been hindered by the storm was staying near the island.

## Exercise 112

1. τῷ εὐρέῳ ποταμῷ κλυθέντες, οἱ πολεμιοὶ ἀπεχώρησαν.
2. ὁ στρατηγὸς ἐκέλευσε τοὺς λυθέντας στρατοπεδεύεσθαι.
3. οἱ κλυθέντες [better perfect: because the main verb is present] οἱ νενικήρηνοι οἴκῳδὲ σπεύδουσιν.
4. ἐθέλομεν μένειν τοὺς ἡμᾶς λυσομένους.
5. δι' λυθείσαι ἔχαιρον (imp: better) ἢ ἐχάρισαν (adv: irregular) [since 'rejoiced' is a state of mind, and is over a period of time, the imperfect is preferable]
6. ὁ Λεονίδας πίπτει γαλχόρηνος ἑίτους Πέρσας.
