

Chapter 6

Exercise 22

1. The slaves have released the horses' yokes.
2. The young man is cutting the tree.
3. The poet has educated me children. [his?]
4. The deeds of the enemy injure the citizens.
5. You (all) have kept the enemy away from the camp.
6. We were sending gifts to the general.
7. The steward's children are bringing the horses.
8. Weapons weigh down soldiers [or: The weapons... the soldiers]
9. The steward has released the slaves.
10. We are carrying weapons to the camp.

note: some seem to me to be generalisations, so I have omitted the deictic.

Exercise 23

1. Τὰ δένδρα τὰ τῆς ρίζου παρέχει τὸν σῖτον.
(sg.)
2. Κεκωλύκαρεν τοὺς ἵππους ἀπὸ τοῦ ποταροῦ.
3. Οἱ δοῦλοι λέλυκε τὸ γυγόν.
4. Τὰ δῶρα οὐκ ἀεὶ πείθει. (generalisation, sg. verb)
5. Πεπιδισύκαρεν τὰ τέκνα.
6. Τὰ τοῦ ναύτου τέκνα φέρει καρπόν
(n.pl. subject → singular verb)
7. Κόκτορεν τὰ τῶν πολεμίων δένδρα.
8. Κεκωλύκατε / -ας τοὺς πέρσας τοῖς στόλοις.
9. Τὰ δένδρα οὐ φέρει καρπόν.
10. Τὰ δῶρα λέλυκε τὴν τοῦ ναύτου γλώσσαν

note: English idiom = "the enemy" = οἱ πολεμίοι (plural)

Exercise 24

- 1 The enemy run risks in the camp.
- 2 We have loosened the fruit from the trees.
- 3 The soldiers were cutting the Athenians' trees.
- 4 The yoke injures the steward's horse
- 5 The citizens' deeds have hindered the enemy
- 6 Poets provide glory to the Athenians.
- 7 The weapons do not weigh down the sailor.
- 8 The soldiers carry trees to the river.
- 9 The steward has trained the horse with a yoke.
- 10 The task weighs down the young men.

- 1 Τὰ τέκνα φέρουσι δῶρα ἀπὸ τῆς ἀγορᾶς.
- 2 κεκωλύκαρεν μάχην ἐν τῇ νήσῳ.
- 3 οἱ ποιῆταις ἔγραψε ἐν τοῖς δένδροις.
- 4 ἐστρατεύομεν πρὸς τὰς τῶν πολεμίων κώμας.
- 5 ή τῆς ἀρίλλης δοῦλα λένκε τὴν τοῦ ποιήτου γλώσσαν.
- 6 Τὰ τῶν στρατιωτῶν ἔργα ἔχει τὴν τιμὴν ἐν τοῖς πολίταις
- 7 πέντορεν ἐπιστολὴν πρὸς τὰς στρατηγόν.
- 8 οἱ Ἀθηναῖοι οὐδὲ μίκνουσι μάχην, αλλὰ φιλίαν.
- 9 πεντίδευκτα τὸν τοῦ στρατιώτα πίπτονται.
- 10 Τὰ ὅπλα οὐ παρέχει τὴν εἰρήνην.

Remember Athens : οἱ Ἀθῆναι τῶν Ἀθηνῶν
(the)Athenians οἱ Ἀθηναῖοι τῶν Ἀθηναίων
