

Chapter 6

Exercise 22

1. The slaves have released the horses' yokes.
2. The young man is cutting the tree.
3. The poet has educated the children. [his?]
4. The deeds of the enemy injure the citizens.
5. ~~You~~ You (all) have kept the enemy away from the camp.
6. We were sending gifts to the general.
7. The steward's children are bringing the horses.
8. Weapons weigh down soldiers [or: The weapons... the soldiers]
9. The steward has released the slaves.
10. We are carrying weapons to the camp.

note: some seem to me to be generalisations, so I have omitted the def-art.

Exercise 23

- 1 τὰ δένδρα τὰ τῆς νήσου παρέχει^(sg.) τὸν σίτον.
- 2 κεκωλύκαμεν τοὺς ἵππους ἀπὸ τοῦ ποταμοῦ.
- 3 ὁ δούλος λέλυκε τὸ ζυγόν.
- 4 τὰ δῶρα οὐκ αἰεί πείθει. (generalisation, sg. verb)
- 5 πεπαιδεύκαμεν τὰ τέκνα.
- 6 τὰ τοῦ ναύτου τέκνα φέρει καρπὸν (n.pl. subject → sing. war verb)
- 7 κόπτομεν τὰ τῶν πολέμιων δένδρα.
- 8 κεκωλύκατε /-ας τοὺς Πέρσας τοῖς ὅπλοις.
- 9 τὰ δένδρα οὐ φέρει καρπὸν.
- 10 τὰ δῶρα λέλυκε τὴν τοῦ ναύτου γλῶσσαν

note: English idiom = "the enemy" = οἱ πολέμιοι (plural)

Exercise 24

- 1 The enemy run risks in the camp.
- 2 We have loosened the fruit from the trees.
- 3 The soldiers were cutting the Athenians' trees.
- 4 The yoke injures the steward's horse.
- 5 The citizens' deeds have hindered the enemy.
- 6 Poets provide glory to the Athenians.
- 7 The weapons do not weigh down the sailor.
- 8 The soldiers carry trees to the river.
- 9 The steward has trained the horse with a yoke.
- 10 The task weighs down the young men.

Exercise 25

- 1 τὰ τέκνα φέρουσι δῶρα ἀπὸ τῆς ἀγοράς.
- 2 κεκωλύκαμεν μάχην ἐν τῇ νήσῳ.
- 3 ὁ ποιήτης ἔγραφε ἐν τοῖς δένδροις.
- 4 ἐστρατεύομεν πρὸς τὰς τῶν πολεμιῶν κώμας.
- 5 ἡ τῆς ἀρίλλης δοῦσα λέλυκε τὴν τοῦ ποιήτου γλῶσσαν.
- 6 τὰ τῶν στρατιωτῶν ἔργα ἔχει τὴν τιμὴν ἐν τοῖς πολιταῖς.
- 7 πέμπομεν ἐπιστολὴν πρὸς τὰ στρατηγόν.
- 8 οἱ Ἀθηναῖοι οὐ διώκουσι μάχην, ἀλλὰ φιλίαν.
- 9 πεπαίδευκα τὸν τοῦ στρατηγοῦ ἵππον.
- 10 τὰ ὄπλα οὐ παρέχει τὴν εἰρήνην.
