APPENDIX 2

PLAYHOUSE INVENTORIES  
NOW LOST

The following inventories of properties, costumes and play-books were first printed by Malone in his *The Plays and Poems of William Shakespeare* (1790), vol. 1, part II, pp. 300-7. He wrote, p. 289, 'In a bundle of loose papers [i.e. at Dulwich College] has also been found an exact inventory of the Wardrobe, playbooks, properties, &c. belonging to the lord Admiral's servants'. These papers have since disappeared. There is no reason to doubt that the lists were genuine, and were probably, if the spelling is a guide, in Henslowe's hand. They were reprinted by Greg, *Henslowe Papers*, pp. 113-23. The first five lists are dated March 1598; Greg thought that they were drawn up 'at the time of the amalgamation of the Admiral's and Pembroke's men in the winter of 1597/8', but the companies joined in October 1597 (*Diary*, ff. 27v, 43v). However, a statement of debt was acknowledged by the sharers between 8 and 13 March 1598, and the lists would appropriately belong to this year. It is just possible that they were made in 1599, when there was no playing during most of March (f. 48v), but the evidence within the lists points to the earlier year, except for two items of doubtful interpretation (see l. 80 and notes). The last two lists can be dated by reference to the *Diary* as not earlier than August 1598, and probably not much later than this. In the list of play-books only one, *Vayvode*, seems out of place as added to the stock in January 1599, but it was in production in August 1598, and its appearance in the list is best explained as an accident; see l. 198 and n. Only a few of the last list of costumes can be certainly traced in the *Diary*, but more may be concealed in the loans to buy 'divers things' which often appear there. The notes to these lists are largely based upon the thorough work of Fleay in his

*Chronicle History of the London Stage* (1890), and Greg; conjectural identifications are marked with a query, and perhaps little reliance is to be placed upon the connecting of a property with a specific play. Difficult words are noted in the Index and Glossary at the end of this volume.
