

## Privacy Notice

### AHRC Collaborative Doctoral Award with the Science Museum

#### Metallic Empire: Science, Energy, and Industrial Imperialism in the John Percy Collection, 1817–89

The University of Warwick will process the personal data which you have provided in your application form for the purposes of recruitment (including interviewing), administering, considering and making a decision regarding whether your application is successful.

The data, including that on the application form, will be shared for the same purposes with the Science Museum, with whom this studentship is jointly managed. The data may also be shared with the funder, the Arts and Humanities Research Council (AHRC) and its Collaborative Doctoral Partnership Consortium (CDPC), which is the scheme through which the AHRC is funding this studentship. Furthermore, the data may also be shared with Je-S, the provider of electronic grant services to the AHRC and the online system by which the funding for this studentship is administered.

If your application is successful, your data will be shared on an ongoing basis with the Science Museum, the AHRC, CDPC, and Je-S as part of processes of jointly monitoring progress and your funding through your studies, and in order to effectively supervise you during your PhD. The legal basis for processing your personal data is the necessity for the performance of a contract and consent (in relation to sensitive data such as health data). If you withdraw your consent during the period of study, we may not be able to continue to support your studies and your funding may stop.

Your personal data will not be shared or disclosed to any third parties external to the University of Warwick except Je-S, AHRC, CDPC, and the Science Museum. The use of your data by AHRC, CDPC and Je-S are set out in their respective privacy notices, which can be found by following the links at the bottom of this document.

Your personal data will not be transferred by the University of Warwick outside of the EEA, will be kept securely by the University of Warwick and will be retained for 1 year following the completion of the admissions process for unsuccessful candidates; and 7 years following the end of the student registration/relationship for the successful candidate.
