5.	What role did the memory of the Battle of Grunwald/Tannenberg (1410) play in Polish nation-building before the Great War?
6.	'Russian nationalism threatened the stability of the Russian Empire'. Discuss.
7.	Why did the Poles gain independence in 1918 whereas the Ukrainians did not?
8.	Compare Soviet and Polish nationality policy towards Ukrainians in the interwar period.
9.	Why did Jan Gross' book <i>Neighbours</i> about the Jedwabne incident cause such an uproar in Poland?
10.	What historical arguments did Putin use to justify the annexation of Crimea?
11.	Discuss the role of historians in national building. Answer with reference to ONE of the countries studied in the module.
12.	Why did the Russian government in 1863 restrict and in 1876 forbid publications in Ukrainian?
