Mr. Johnson outlined the alternatives being evaluated by the work group for improving our program in four areas: (1) at border ports of entry and airports; (2) land smuggling between ports of entry; (3) air smuggling; and (4) boat smuggling. In addition, he outlined alternatives being looked at which cut across all aspects of the problem and re-emphasized the importance of improving "post-arrest immobilization," as g stressed in the white paper.

The CIA representative asked if the work group was perhaps misdirecting its efforts by concentrating on the border in light of the difficulty of detecting drugs amid the enormous volume of vehicles and persons crossing the border. Mr. Parson acknowledged the difficulty of interdicting at the border, and said that the work group was attempting to develop recommendations dealing with all three parts of the system: within Mexico, at the border, and within the interior United States. Mr. Johnson said that the work group was particularly impressed by the inter-relationship of these three aspects, and was looking for ways to improve each so that the overally effort would be optimized.




Chicano Database




