The further Security of the Persons of Her Majesty's Subjects from personal Violence.

HEREAS by the Forty-third Section of the Act of the Preamble. Session of the Twenty-fourth and Twenty-fifth Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, Chapter Ninety-six, it is provided that "whosoever shall, being armed with any offensive 5 " Weapon or Instrument, rob or assault with Intent to rob any " Person, or shall together with One or more other Person or " Persons rob or assault with Intent to rob any Person, or shall rob " any Person, and at the Time of or immediately before or imme-" diately after such Robbery shall wound, beat, strike, or use any 10 " other personal Violence to any Person, shall be guilty of Felony, " and being convicted thereof shall be liable, at the Discretion of the " Court, to be kept in Penal Servitude for Life, or for any Term not " less than Three Years, or to be imprisoned for any Term not ex-" ceeding Two Years, with or without Hard Labour, and with or 15 " without Solitary Confinement:" And whereas the Punishment awarded by the said Section is insufficient to deter Robbers from using Violence in the Commission of their Crimes: Be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this [Bill 35.] present

present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

Award of Punishment of Whipping.

- 1. Where any Person is convicted of a Crime under the said Section, the Court before whom he is convicted may, in addition to or in substitution for the Punishment awarded by the said Section or 5 any Part thereof, direct that the Offender, if a Male, be once, twice, or thrice publicly or privately whipped, subject to the following Provisions:
 - 1. That in the Case of an Offender whose Age does not exceed Sixteen Years the Number of Strokes do not exceed Twenty- 10 five, and the Instrument used shall be a Birch Rod:
 - 2. That in the Case of any other Male Offender the Conviction shall specify the Number of Strokes to be inflicted, such Number not in any Case to exceed Fifty.
