- Q. : Have you <u>already</u> finished you report?
 - <u>もう</u>、レポートを 書きましたか。
- A. : Yes, I have <u>already</u>.

<u>もう</u>、書きました。

No, I haven't yet. (I mean to do so, but.....)

いいえ、まだ書いていません。

No, I did not write it. (I don't have an intension to do so)

いいえ、書きませんでした。
