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You use に します after a noun to state your decision when choosing something from among several available alternative.

A に します

Your decision/choice

Q. Which one of the deserts will you have?

A. I will have the ice cream.

↓

Q. What present have you chosen to buy?

A. I have chosen a T-shirt.

↓
Your decision/choice = firm decision

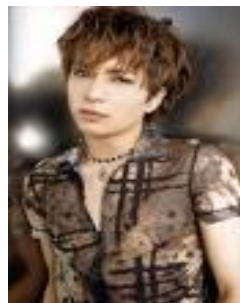
