

- Rank your preferred universities in order;
- Places will be decided on the basis of your first-year exam performance for Y2 students going abroad in Y3 and on adaptability and A-Level performance (or equivalent) for Y2 students;

There are many high quality schools in Portugal that offer courses throughout the summer at very competitive rates. In Brazil the summer period is from December to March, making summer courses offered by schools based in this country less attractive. There are however very good options here too.

Universidade Federal de Minas Gerais (UFMG)14-27th July

Two scholarships are provided to University of Warwick students in 2019. The scholarship includes the tuition fee, campus accommodation and three meals (on campus) a day.

Coimbra also offers intensive language courses in February and <u>September</u>.

#### University of Aveiro

- 28 August to 15 September (All 4SPIC application forms must be sent before June, 30, 2019)
- 90 hours subdivided in the following way:
- 60 hours in the classroom
- 22 hours of cultural or sport activities
- 8 hours of complementary activities

Fee: from €450 to €790 (the latter price includes accomodation)

Studying during your stay in universities based in countries where Portuguese is not spoken

Work Placements in Portuguese-speaking countries

- Will you get a salary?
