sermo (-nis, m, 3); sermone; sermones
animi (N. – animus, m, 2) – Genitive singular
sapientia (-ae, f, 1) – Nominative singular
meritis (N. – meritum, -i, n, 2) – Ablative plural (*here caused by preposition pro*)
amicus (-i, m, 2) – Nominative singular
deum (N. – deus, -i, m, 2, irregular) – Accusative singular
fama (-ae, f, 1) – Nominative singular
fraus (-dis, f, 3)
consilium – Accusative singular
dominus (-ni, m, 2) – Nominative singular
servi (N. – servus, m, 2) – Genitive singular
sensus (N. – sensus, -us, m, 4)

- b. ad modum (acc. sing., m., 2 = according to) nostro more (abl.sing = our custom)
- c. propter studium (acc.sing., n, 2 = because of zeal)
- d. sentiis (abl.plur. of *sententia* – f, 1 = instrumental meaning, by means of the verdict, lit. – views) iudicium (gen. plur. = of the judges)

Task 2

- e. Sophocles (N., m., 2, sentence subject) ad summam senectutem (acc. singular) tragoedias (acc. plural, f., 1, direct object) fecit (predicate, perfect active).
- f. A filiis (abl. plur., n, 2) in iudicium (gen.plur. = to the judges) vocatus est (passive).
- g. Fabulam (acc.sing., f, 1) quam in manibus (abl.plur, f, 3 = Ablative of place, in hands; caused by *in + Abl*) habebat (imperfect active) iudicibus (dat.plur., indirect object) recitasse (perfect active infinitive – there is an indirect speech construction causing this form to appear)

- h. Quo recitato (Abl.sing. – *because of, by means of this recitation*) sententiis (abl.plur. – *by means of*) iudicum est liberatur (perf.passive, *was set free*).
