Enter one of the following as your response:

- ▶ A 1,000-1,500 word essay
- ▶ A 4-minute video/podcast essay
- ▶ A photo/series of photos and a 500 word (maximum) commentary
- ▶ An artistic exploration (for example, a painting, poetry, a short story or a short film) and a 500 word (maximum) commentary

The competition is open to you if you're in year 11 or 12 in the UK, or if you're a school pupil in the 15 to 17 year old age group equivalent. Shortlisted entrants will be invited to a virtual event, hosted by the University of Warwick's Global Sustainable Development (GSD) Department. Winners will be announced and each awarded a £50 prize.

Deadline: Midnight, Friday 30 April 2021

What is GSD?

The United Nations defines GSD as "development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs".
