Hi all, would you be able to provide some clarification on the application process timeline. Are applications for this September now finished and intake would now be for September 2022? Joao - I am really interested in sustainability research, what do you think the best focus would be if I wanted to use my experience/research and implement it into the corporate world in my future career.



Also - how do you envisage that the course will be impacted by COVID?



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With regard to the timeline for applications, for a September start date, the deadline to apply would be 31 July. It is, however, possible to start a PhD at any time of year. If you are looking for funding then some of the deadlines may have already passed for the 2021/22 academic year.



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Hi Jessica, many thanks for your question it is great to hear about your interest on sustainability. I would recommend you to check in the supervisor pages in our website and look for the best alignment with your interests. We have a broad range of supervisory capacity and many colleagues would be able to help you with topics that can be incorporated to a number of future career pathways.



Also - how do you envisage that the course will be impacted by COVID?

We are planning to go ahead with the programme for 2021/22 and don't envisage that the course will be impacted too much by Covid. The term 1 taught module is likely to be delivered via blended learning rather than 100% face-to-face teaching but this will not impact the quality.

The individual projects will be different for next year but the themes will continue. I hope this is helpful to you.

2021 Suggested project topics

Unless you are planning to submit your own project, you should select a project topic within which to develop your research. Applicants should limit their application to one research project and demonstrate how they would make the project their own in addition to evidencing their fit with the student specification and skillset which will vary with each project. All successful candidates will work with an external organisation which will provide mentorship. This organisation will be detailed on the proposed projects or agreed between the supervisory team and student for the open competition award-holder.

Hi Jessica, we do have partnerships with external organisations for specific PhD topics and there is an opportunity for adding an external mentor to your PhD. Usually this relationship builds upon existing connections either from the supervisor or student.

Yes absolutely! I think something that makes the GSD community at Warwick so special is the closeknit community it creates, all the students and staff have a really good bond which means that teaching and learning is always centred around what is best for the current students. Learning throughout Covid has been quite tough but the staff have been so supportive and students set up peer support groups to make sure everyone was keeping in touch which is so lovely. As a finalist I particularly enjoyed my dissertation which was supervised by Dr Marco Haenssgen and funded by the GSD Department. I opted for a creative submission which was impacted by covid but I had many 1-to-1 meetings and extra guidance to make sure my project was still a success! I would recommend studying GSD at Warwick not just for the academic aspect but for the wonderful family that you become a part of - it is truly life changing!

Yes, I think studying during Covid tends to put people off but I found that the support never wained, if anything increased during the period of online learning and there were still many opportunities to have online socials and events with other students - hopefully this coming academic year will be better in terms of blended teaching but if not I would still suggest enrolling for the upcoming year!



For the first year of our postgraduate programmes (MASc and PhD) we are anticipating cohorts for each of around 10 students so an overall PG community of 20+ students. We have plenty of support in place with Directors of PGT and PGR along with myself (full-time) and a Postgraduate Coordinator (part-time) to help with all practical aspects of studying at Warwick. We are very excited to be launching these new programmes and will do our very best to ensure their success!
