Hi Ali, indeed these courses do have a clear connection - all the joint honours do and the modules that you would study in it are selected for how they relate and enable transferrable learning. My own background is in Sociology, as with several of our colleagues.

I've been going for research roles, also there's some sustainability internships with businesses I've pursued. Businesses are becoming more and more keen to get sustainability people. I also recently applied to a sustainability apprenticeship with the BBC that ends with a job as sustainability advisor.

Do joint honours students get to take considerably less optional modules due to effectively having half the time to study the course?



Well essentially it means you have less optionality, but you also have more access to the partner department's modules. That's why it's useful to fully consider what your core interest is when applying.

In basic terms, it can be as much as 50-50. We are however the most international department in the entire faculty! By which I mean we have lots of international students, and from all over the world!


Do joint honours students get to take considerably less optional modules due to effectively having half the time to study the course?


