**Robeson—and
six Negroes**

FIVE THOUSAND trade unionists cheered Mr. Paul Robeson when he sang and spoke yesterday in the Belle Vue Gardens, Manchester, at a meeting organised by the Lancashire and Cheshire Federation of Trades Councils and the New International Society. The audience joined in a protest against the sentence of death passed on six Negroes at Trenton, New Jersey, where, said Robeson: "The police just went out into the street and arrested the first six coloured boys they came across and charged them with the murder of a white doorkeeper they had never seen."
