

Research Assistant in Global 19th-Century Studies at Warwick

Part time: 2 hours per week

Global 19th-Century Studies at Warwick is a new cross-disciplinary research cluster that aims to showcase Warwick's wide and deep expertise in nineteenth-century studies across all languages and disciplines, bringing together colleagues and students with interests in the global nineteenth century in order to:

- learn about one another's work
- develop collaborative research and teaching projects
- raise the profile of Warwick's nineteenth-century expertise both within and beyond the University.

Thanks to a successful funding bid to Warwick's Connecting Cultures GRP, we now invite applications for the post of part-time Research Assistant (RA) in Global 19th-Century Studies at Warwick. The post is for 2 hours per week during the academic year 2015-2016 and is remunerated at £20 p.h. It is open to both postgraduate and postdoctoral candidates, and while related research interests may be an advantage they are not essential.

The RA's principal duties will be:

1. To assist in gathering information about teaching, research and other activities at Warwick with nineteenth-century connections
2. To help maintain the G19C web presence (knowledge of SiteBuilder ID7 or a willingness to undertake appropriate training will be essential)
3. To assist with G19C communications and social media
