IATL Modules in 2026/27

Shakespeare in Venice (new for 2026/27)

Part of the Venice Short Courses (VSC) programme, this immersive module offers a rare chance to study *The Merchant of Venice* and *Othello* in Venice itself, alongside students from Warwick, Monash, and Ca' Foscari. Open to all disciplines, it blends multidisciplinary learning, site-specific exploration, and global perspectives on Shakespeare's most debated plays. You'll examine history, performance, culture, and identity through guided tours, workshops, and collaborative discussions. Teaching takes place in the Warwick Venice Centre, Palazzo Giustinian Lolin, from 12–19

Global Connections (EUTOPIA)

Global Connections (EUTOPIA) is an exciting, transdisciplinary module exploring how globalisation shapes culture, politics, sustainability, migration, health and more.

Through blended learning, expert-led workshops, and multidisciplinary teamwork, students examine whose voices shape global knowledge and why. A standout feature is the international EUTOPIA project, where you collaborate with students across Europe on real-world global challenges. This module builds intercultural awareness, global thinking, and cross-university networks.
