Policy complicated by different accompanying meanings...

- *Food nationalism*: self-sufficiency, autarky
- *Food defence*: feeding in dire circumstances
- *Food control*: the actions of state (rationing)
- *Food resilience*: capacity to withstand shock
- *Food risks*: factors which threaten goals
- *Food sovereignty*: ensuring societal control
- *Food democracy*: full social engagement
- *Food capacity*: capability to produce
- *Community food security*: local food systems

Policy battles

- **Where do we fix boundaries?** global, national, local, town/village, family?
- **What do we mean by 'food'?** quantity, quality, health, appropriateness, taste?
- **What supply routes?** home, traded, local?
- **What price?** affordability, buyer price, real price, externalised costs?
- **What policy frameworks?** national or multilevel?
- **Which actors?** state, supply chain or consumers?
