

Andrey Bychkov is a Director of Digital Pathology at Kameda Medical Center, Japan and a Visiting Associate Professor at Nagasaki University. He graduated with an M.D. from Russia where he also completed residency training and practiced in anatomic pathology. Later, he earned a Ph.D. in molecular medicine in Nagasaki. His subspecialty is thyroid pathology and he has contributed to the 2022 WHO classifications of endocrine and contributed to the 2022 WHO classifications of endocrine and hematolymphoid tumors. Dr. Bychkov is actively engaged in the projects of the Asian Working Group in Thyroid Pathology, which addresses differences between Asian and western approaches to thyroid FNA and thyroid nodules in general. Currently he is deeply involved in the development of the Kameda Digital Pathology Network, which is one the few Asian facilities that have successfully adopted digital pathology and Al for primary diagnosis. Dr. Bychkov is a deputy editor for PathologyOutlines, associate editor for JPTM and Front Med, and academic editor for several international journals (PLOS One, etc.). He has published extensively and has authored about 100 journal articles and book chapters.
