WHAT IS AN IMPACT LAB?

An Impact Lab is a dynamic workshop designed to create a clear roadmap for translating research into real-world impact.

Tailored for projects that are complete or nearing completion, the session brings together key players - the project team, academics, InRA members, and impact and funding experts - to collaborate and innovate.

After a concise project overview, participants brainstorm actionable strategies that may lead to new funding opportunities or industry partnerships, ensuring that the research delivers measurable and practical benefits.

CORE SCHEDULE

PRESENTATION

An overview of work completed so far. Often these presentations are given by the Innovation Research Associate(s) involved in the project.

PATHWAY EXPLORATION

Discussion around potential pathways to impact, including funding that could be applied for.

NEXT STEPS

A list of actions is agreed and taken away by participants.

PROJECT ENDS

An Impact Lab is typically held after the end of a project involving CAMaCS researchers.

IMPACT LAB

Typically a two-hour workshop involving Key stakeholders from the project, aligned to the schedule above.

FUTURE AVENUES

Impact Lab results in an agreed list of actions and goals, which may include applications for funding.
