Our research in Chemistry has many facets, as can be seen in many recent news stories from the department. This includes publication of high-profile papers, hosting of significant international conferences, such as this summer's MACRO World Polymer Congress, the largest single event hosted by Warwick campus, and awards of fellowships to our postgraduates to further their research careers. Spin-out companies from the department are going from strength to strength with external recognition of their impact for work in drug delivery, and in polymer additives for practical application.

Collaboration in research has always been important for Chemistry at Warwick and, looking forward, the university is soon to launch the Centre for Experimental Fuel Technologies, with significant funding to cement collaborations between science departments at Warwick. This initiative will be led by Chemistry and will allow recruitment of fellows and PhD students in collaborative projects that span our subject from experiment to theory and its interfaces with physics and engineering. This is aligned with the STEM-Connect initiative, which is now physically taking shape with the first steps of construction of new buildings now underway, as you cannot fail to notice.

Our research profile continues to evolve to meet global challenges spanning life sciences, the environment, and energy. These important areas of our research also inform our undergraduate teaching, and so I wanted to take the opportunity to highlight our department's 'Research Showcase' event that will take place on November 27th 2-4pm: this is a chance for our students to learn about our research in a role-reversal poster session where academic staff present their

group's recent work. All are welcome to attend this event to learn about diversity of research that goes on in the department, and after last year's successful event, we look forward to a lively few hours of discussion.
