University of Warwick has a strong commitment to eliminating sexual misconduct in any form and supporting survivors. One of the five Warwick Principles states 'We do not tolerate sexual misconduct, violence or abuse' (our sexual misconduct policy at the University of Warwick).

All students must complete and receive 100% on the <u>Warwick Values Moodle</u> (content not accessible externally) upon enrolment. The Moodle explains Warwick Principles and Values and includes information on consent, different forms of sexual misconduct, the Warwick Sexual Misconduct Policy, potential repercussions for breaching this policy and information on Warwick support services for survivors.

In addition, the University of Warwick team at <u>'Report + Support'</u> offer online resources and also elective <u>one-hour awareness sessions</u> for all students and staff throughout the academic year which help attendees:

- Gain an understanding of the different forms that Sexual Misconduct, Discrimination and Hate Crime can take, and how it may affect individuals.
- Learn how to respond to disclosures of Sexual Violence, Harassment and Hate Crime

Active Bystander courses and workshops

The <u>Community Values Education Programme</u> (academic lead: Dr Jane Bryan) sits in the Dean of Student's Office and delivers active bystander information to students across Warwick (one-hour orientation workshops and ten-hour Student Leaders courses) all of which are open to all undergraduates.

All incoming undergraduate students in the academic year 2020/21 were expected to attend a one-hour Introduction to Active Bystander workshop which was held in term one. For academic year 2021/2, these online workshops will be mandatory for all departments to timetable for their incoming undergraduate and postgraduate taught students in term one and students will be expected to attend. The workshops offer an introduction to active bystander principles.

Two executive members from each SU club and society must attend an Active Bystander Student Leaders course (ten hours) scheduled in terms two and three (SU Mandate Spring 2021).

Additional course places are available for self-selecting students. Staff Student Liaison Committee course reps are encouraged to attend. The course builds on the learning from the workshops to equip participants with the knowledge, skills and confidence to make safe interventions if they see unacceptable behaviour.
