


Catchment Partnerships in Warwickshire, Coventry and Solihull

Developing Catchment wide approaches to engage more people e.g. rainwater harvesting to tackle water resources Secured funding for Warwickshire Avon catchment from Water Resources Engagement Fund 2023-24

Catchment

Based Approach

- to widen range of people involved and raise awareness of declining water resources
 14.7k
- Reported 119 ha habitat created and 26 km of watercourse enhanced in 2022/23 in Warwickshire Avon
- Input to both the EA River Basin and Flood Risk Management Plans in 2022
- Quarterly Site visits and Catchment meetings held, 20 – 26 people attending each session

Project delivery - examples

- 6+ Flood Action groups active in catchments delivering Natural Flood Management projects, pool creation, hedgerow restoration, to slow flows
- Major River Restoration work river Blythe SSSI, River Sherbourne
- Local brook enhancement work e.g. Guphill brook, Coventry (images)
- Funds from Environment Agency, Severn Trent, Town Council CIL, ERDF funds for project delivery
