


Triangulate: Name the national park that lies closest to the center of the triangle (centre of the inscribed circle) with vertices given by the pictures.

1 point for the name of each bridge, 2 points for the national park [hints: perimeter of the triangle \approx 620mi. The bridges include (in no particular order) (i) a crossing of the the River Severn and symbol of the Industrial Revolution that gives its name to a neighbouring village of population 2,582 (2011 census), (ii) first built 250 years ago, a rope bridge that crosses the Atlantic Ocean and in 2017 was “closed for the foreseeable future” only to reopen the following day, and (iii) a £1 toll bridge 101 metres above the River Avon built in 1864.]:



1 point for each location contained in the names of the cheeses and 2 points for the national park closest to the center of the triangle [hints: perimeter of triangle \approx 310mi. The following cheeses include (i) a cheese named after a West Midlands county in which one of the bridges above is situated, (ii) a favorite of Wallace who is credited with saving the brand after facing bankruptcy in the 1990s, and (iii) a cheese giving its name to a city that has sports teams including the Riders, Tigers, and Falcons]



1 point for each island or isles and 2 points for the national park closest to the centre of the triangle [hints: perimeter of triangle \approx 440mi. These places include (i) the setting of a popular sit-com last aired in a Christmas day special almost 10 years after the conclusion of the most recent series of the show, (ii) one of the last places in southern England to see indigenous red squirrels and (iii) an archipelago 25 miles off the coast of Britain in the constituency last to declare in the 2019 general election (results were delayed due to a storm preventing the collection of ballots from the islands).]
