HOW TO PREPARE FOR GIVING A TALK IN THE POSTGRADUATE SEMINAR

FIND A MATHS TOPIC YOU FEEL PASSIONATE ABOUT.

SEND US AN EMAIL SO THAT WE CAN FIND A DATE THAT WORKS FOR YOU.

THINK ABOUT THE FORMAT. YOU CAN EITHER DO A BLACKBOARD TALK OR PREPARE SOME SLIDES BUT, EITHER WAY, BEAR IN MIND THAT THE TALK MUST LAST AT MOST 50 MINUTES.

THINK ABOUT YOUR AUDIENCE. THIS IS NOT A SPECIALISED SEMINAR SO DO NOT ASSUME THAT PEOPLE WILL KNOW DEFINITIONS THAT YOU FIND BASIC. A GOOD RULE OF THUMB IS TO PREPARE THE TALK IN SUCH A WAY THAT AT LEAST THE FIRST THIRD CAN BE EASILY FOLLOWED BY ANYONE WHO IS A POSTGRADUATE STUDENT IN MATHEMATICS, AND THE REMAINING TWO THIRDS ARE ACCESSIBLE TO A STUDENT WORKING IN YOUR AREA.

PREPARE A TITLE AND A SHORT ABSTRACT (80 WORDS) AND SEND IT TO US AT LEAST ONE WEEK BEFORE THE DAY OF YOUR TALK.

PRACTISE YOUR TALK. PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT, AFTER ALL.

THE DAY OF YOUR TALK, PLEASE ARRIVE 5 MINUTES BEFORE THE TALK SO THAT YOU CAN PREPARE YOUR MATERIAL TO START AT NOON.
