The above amendment was reviewed at the meeting of the Sub-Committee held on 25 November 2018 by the Sub-Committee in correspondence.

Summary

This amendment sought to correct information on risk of shoulder dystocia in women with big babies as it had been previously underestimated in the PIS. The rectification would provide an opportunity for women currently recruited to decide whether they wish to continue in the trial or not.

Discussion

The Sub-Committee was advised that this NOSA covered the new information being given to new participants and the information given to those currently pregnant and re-consented as part of the Urgent Safety Measure.

Whilst The Chief Investigator and Sponsor requested the RECs opinion about the most ethical way of contacting the group of women who had already given birth and whose children had documented dystocia, it was made clear that this was not part of this amendment.

It was therefore agreed the discussion with the CI would be about this specific point and could be done at a different time, whether by teleconference with a few members or at full REC as an agenda item prior to the second NOSA being submitted. The REC would also seek paediatricians opinion on this if deemed necessary.

Ethical opinion

The members of the Committee taking part in the review gave a favourable ethical opinion of the amendment on the basis described in the notice of amendment form and supporting documentation.
