

Follow up is going well with 91% at 3 months, 88% at 6 months and 72% at 12 months to date.


The DRAFFT team submitted an amendment to ethics this month to ask if we can continue recruiting beyond the 390 target and will contact all centres as soon as we have a response.

A look back over 2011 January February

Amendment one was approved by ethics on the 7th January which meant consent form v 2.0 24/11/2010 was implemented. By the end of January 8 centres were open for recruitment and 81 participants had been recruited.



The annual ethics report was submitted and copies sent out to all sites for their site file. Addenbrookes opened for recruitment in February and by the end of the month we had recruited 108 participants.

March, April, May and June Were quiet months, 61 patients were recruited and 4 centres opened for recruitment.

July We reached 50% of our recruitment target (195 participants) 3 months ahead of schedule.

The first patient recruited reached their 12 month time point.

September The Trial Coordinator started performing monitoring visits for sites that have been open for 6 months or recruited over 15 participants. The trial protocol was also published in the BMC Muskoskeletal Disorders.

October We held the first collaborators day on the 20th October where Research Associates from each centre joined us in Warwick to discuss the progress of the trial to date, screening issues and to have a go at fixing wrists with plates and wires.

November The 300th participant was recruited on the 28th November. The trial team initiated the final centre to open for recruitment and Matt was promoted to Professor of Trauma and Orthopaedics. The team submitted substantial amendment three to ask ethics for approval

to recruit above the original 390 target. December
