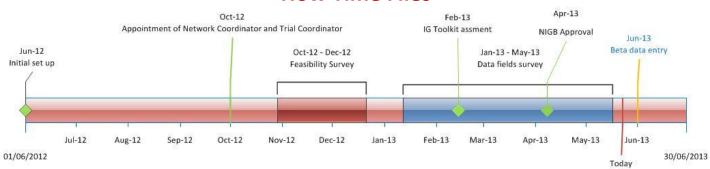

Out of Hospital Cardiac Arrest Outcomes

Welcome to our second issue of the OHCAO Project Newsletter. Since February we have achieved completion of the project's central governance approvals and have continued to undertake site visits to review the potential data fields survey and data flows with each Service audit department. Those sites visits undertaken, without exception, have so far gone very well. The most common question raised during these visits has been the concern expressed regarding the extra hours and resource workload that this project may demand on already very busy audit departments. The project wants to reassure everyone, that at this stage we only want a replication of information already collected monthly by each service, for submission to the DoH. We look forward to your continued support provided to this project.

How Time Flies



The project now has most of the data field charts received from participating Ambulance Services, so that we can push forward in designing the web based data portal for trial testing in June. The next trial Steering Committee meeting is scheduled for mid-June and the key objective for this meeting is to review the data definitions and decide upon which parameters to use for generating reporting services back to ambulance services. If you have any ideas on what reports would benefit your service, please drop us an email. Ideas such as displaying 'Clinical Commissioning Group' area performance and data quality have been suggested to help each service in making strategic and economic performance reviews.

Project Status

Upon local Trust approval and Site Agreement completed, the project can progress towards the goal for each Service to provide their raw data samples in order to facilitate the database design and mapping. Our thanks go to North West Ambulance **Service NHS Trust for** providing us with our first raw data sample set to start the database development (programming, mapping,

validation etc).

Visit to TARN

During May, the OHCAO team were invited by Professor Tim Cotes to visit the TARN network group, an audit and research network for trauma patients attending UK hospitals, which provides coding, comparisons, benchmarking, reporting and research analysis. The team reviewed examples of reporting styles, learnt from TARN's experience, and now have some ideas of how to best provide reports for ambulance services.

Information Governance Training

The project team have completed Information Governance training, as part of their improvement plan after gaining a 74% published result from the 2013 Tool kit assessment. Eventually the whole Clinical Trials Unit department will undertake IG toolkit assessment and training as information governance best practice and as part of our improvement plan.
