

Are you being treated for breast cancer?



If so, you may be interested in the SWEET study

What is the SWEET study?

Am I eligible?

SWEET (<u>Supporting Women with adhErence to hormonE Therapy</u> following breast cancer) is a research study aiming to help support women to keep taking their hormone therapy after breast cancer.



Can I take part?

If you have been prescribed hormone therapy tablets (including tamoxifen, or an aromatase inhibitor such as letrozole, anastrazole or exemestane) for breast cancer in the last 3 months, you may be eligible to take part. You must also have access to an email address.

What would I have to do?

If you agree to take part, you will be put into one of two groups. This will be decided by chance - neither you or your breast care team can decide. You will either get a support package called **HT&Me**, or you will receive your usual care. You will also be asked to complete some questionnaires.

Why is this research important?

This study has been designed to help improve support for women taking hormone therapy. If more women are able to take their hormone therapy every day, fewer will experience breast cancer coming back.
