This course will provide participants with an overview of some of the key ethical theories, principles and values currently used to identify, explain and understand ethical issues and tensions in healthcare delivery and practice. It will introduce relevant legal concepts and principles and relevant law (as it applies to England and Wales). The course will be delivered in an environment in which participants can develop and hone skills of argument and ethical analysis, and will allow them to practice applying the knowledge they acquire. They will emerge with a greater appreciation of the ethical dimensions of healthcare in its broadest sense.
