BibTex with .bib from ADS is strongly encouraged and will give you references with the title, the DOI, and the ADS link all of which are very useful. Book/conference proceedings with a publisher name require the city as well. Sometimes for conference proceeds one has to hack the .bbl.

Word users can compile a .bib with all of the references, and I can convert it to .rtf for them.

Supplementary Information associated with the article are encouraged for data in general, movies, code, tables, ... There is no author page charge and no charge for color figures. We strongly encourage the use of different line/point styles so that graphics in color still work on a black and white printer and for our color-blind readers. It is generally most simple to create a PDF of your article yourself, and only upload the article source files and graphics at the end, to avoid compiling the PDF on the Editorial Manager. SIs need to be submitted to the Editorial Manager so that the reviewer can have access to them
