I am writing with details of a new round of the <u>Policy Support Fund</u> which has recently launched. Please share with anyone who may be interested in applying.

Policy Support Fund: Internal grants of up to £50k to be spent by 31 July 2023

Internal grants of up to £50k are available for research projects that can fully spend by 31 July 2023, delivered in conjunction with external organisations, with bids on a short application form invited by Friday 30 September 2022 to Research_lmpact@warwick.ac.uk.

Eligible projects should be focussed on contributing to policy change, whether this be at the level of a regional, national, or international organisation, and encompassing work with parliament, central government, devolved administrations, local government, health and education bodies, the justice system, and a wide range of regulatory organisations.

Projects that are concerned with sustainable economic growth, enhancing regional and national productivity, COVID-19 societal and economic recovery, and levelling-up via R&D would be of particular, but not exclusive, interest.

The Policy Support Fund must be fully spent by 31 July 2023. However, applicants are invited to indicate where projects could be extended beyond that date, such that a pipeline of potential future projects can be established in the area of 'policy impact'.

Funding in excess of £50k may be available for transformational projects with a demonstrable ability to fully spend by 31 July 2023, but these should be discussed in advance with the R&IS Impact Team, who are also available to provide general advice and guidance on this call. UPDATE FROM WEST MIDLANDS BPS

This is the quarterly update from the BPS West Midlands Branch, a chance to fill you in on our plans, update you on other ongoing work related to psychology, and invite you and colleagues there to work with us on these or indeed any other common areas of interest.

Branch objectives

At the beginning of September the Branch met to develop its business plan for the coming year. We confirmed our key priorities are:

to engage with and enthuse undergraduates and new psychologists in our region,

- to focus work on cross cutting themes crucial for all psychologists in the West Midlands, especially the lack of diversity in psychology and the climate crisis,
- to bring professional psychologists together sharing skills and knowledge,
- to bring psychological expertise and knowledge to bear on improving the wellbeing of people living in the West Midlands

Our 2022/23 focus

In the coming year we want to continue to build relationships with every University. We held three very successful careers events with a core theme of diversity in psychology last year and we plan to hold more in the coming year. We have a range of great speakers and are also building a video library of presentations.

We are supporting the BPS Student Ambassador scheme, building links with student interest groups, and will be funding summer placements, awards, bursaries and grants for students. We plan to restart more of our local hubs, and will be exploring whether we can support some outreach into local schools.

Other key activities

We work closely with the Psychological Professions Network (PPN). The PPN advise, influence and inform stakeholders across the Midlands to promote the expansion of the psychological professions in line with NHS workforce ambitions. PPN Midlands are organising a free half day event from 10-12 on 5th October to celebrate achievements over the past 2yrs, and to showcase new psychology roles emerging in NHS commissioned services. We would encourage students and tutors to join the PPN, for free membership and to attend the event go to www.ppn.nhs.uk. PPN Midlands also facilitate a Community of Practice for Aspiring psychological Professionals, which is a useful forum for all students in psychological education. Diversifying access into Clinical Psychology training: The Pathfinder - West Midlands Mentoring Scheme

With funding from Higher Education England (HEE), the three Clinical Psychology Training programmes in the West Midlands have developed a mentoring scheme as part of their wider Equality, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) initiatives. The scheme, entitled Pathfinder - West Midlands, offers Aspiring Clinical Psychologists from under-represented ethnic backgrounds up to 6 hours' worth of one-to-one mentoring sessions from either a qualified or trainee Clinical Psychologist. The purpose of the scheme is to help the mentees achieve a set of goals related to their future career aspirations within the profession, with a view to increase their changes of gaining access onto a clinical training programme.
