They will be awarding up to 20 studentships nationally through this call via the DTPs, and each DTP can put forward up to 4 proposals for consideration. The details of what ARIA is seeking in a roundtable discussion proposal are as follows:

- Describe in less than 300 words where and how investment from ARIA could have a transformative impact that is otherwise unlikely.
 - Examples of how you might frame your roundtable pitch:
 - Contrary to popular belief, transformational change is possible in field X because of Y
 - The intersection of field X and field Y holds tremendous promise but is underfunded.
 - In 10 years, nascent field X will be seen as mainstream and high impact; ARIA has a chance to accelerate it.
 - Field X would deliver enormous impact if only funded in this novel way Y.
 - The UK research enterprise has a unique strength in X that could deliver enormous impact if only supported in this novel way Y.
- Suggest 5-7 other invitees who could best contribute to the roundtable discussion: include their email, organisation, and one sentence biographies.

Advice from ARIA:

- We aren't looking for polished pitches, your proposal should take less than 20 minutes to draft.
- We aren't seeking programme proposals at this stage the roundtables should be seen as brainstorm sessions with zero expectation of subsequent funding from ARIA.
- We are looking for diverse perspectives from roundtable attendees try to suggest invitees from different institutions, backgrounds, geographies, etc.
- Seniority and job title of the proposer or attendees does not matter.
- Roundtables will be held under Chatham House rules to encourage an open and honest exchange of ideas.
- We will review requests to host a roundtable on a rolling basis. If selected, we will contact you and other invitees directly to arrange the virtual roundtable. ARIA's CEO, Ilan Gur, will attend each roundtable.

If you are submitting a proposal for a roundtable discussion we would be grateful if you could share a copy with Research and Impact Services so we can track ideas being submitted by colleagues across Warwick and provide any future support that may be required should you be selected to host a Roundtable discussion – please notify us via ResearchStrategyDev@warwick.ac.uk.




