

NEWS

COST OF LIVING SUPPORT

Hear from Stuart Croft, Vice-Chancellor, on our package for supporting our community. For students, support will include:

- An extra £570,000 to help students from lower income families through our existing bursary scheme.
- One in ten students (3,200) currently receive a bursary from the University, with annual allowances tiered depending on household incomes, up to a maximum of £35,000.
- They will all benefit from a 10% increase in payments, which will be paid from December.
- The additional funds will be paid through the bursary scheme meaning students will receive the money automatically without having to apply for it.
- Warwick has also increased support for post graduate research students receiving the 'minimum stipend' with a 10% rise in their allowance, reflecting the increased rate of inflation. This was in addition to a 3% increase which had already been approved.

For staff, support will include:

- Cost of living payment to eligible salaried employees on Grades 1a-5. Those working full time will receive £550, and those working part time will receive a prorated payment based on FTE. We will make this payment to eligible staff (employed on or before 31 October, and still employed on 1 February 2023) in January.
- Staff support fund to make interest free loans to eligible salaried employees at all grades, if they are struggling with unexpected costs or changes in personal circumstances. We'll be sharing details of the application process in December.
- A new free online personal finance platform, with tips, tools and expert advice, coming soon. This will be in addition to the Employee Assistance Programme, which also offers support on financial matters.

<u>Staff</u> and <u>student</u> hubs will bring together details, relevant offers and support.

I'm a member of Warwick Marrow, the student-led branch of Anthony Nolan, a national blood cancer charity. We work to sign students aged 16-30 to the stem cell register, in the hope they could go on and save someone's life. We are running an urgent appeal for 4-year-old Erin who's family have been told the devastating news that her acute lymphoblastic leukaemia has returned, but sadly her big sister Neave isn't a match. So she desperately needs a stem cell transplant from someone she has never met. It takes just 5 minutes to sign up and you could save someone's life. The Midlands Graduate School DTP is now accepting applications for their <u>Open Competition</u> and proposals for their <u>supervisor-led collaborative and joint competitions Deadline</u>: 16 November 2022.

Joint studentships are for projects that would benefit from cross-institution supervision. While the primary supervisor needs to be based at a Department that is part of the Graduate School (as we are), the secondary supervisor can be drawn from outside the Graduate school as long as they are based at one of the participating institutions. CALL FOR EUTOPIA SCIENCE AND INNOVATION FELLOWSHIP APPLICATIONS

Providing two-year funding for early career researchers, <u>apply for a chance to develop research</u> at two co-hosting EUTOPIA universities, and a placement a with an external partner institution. Chancellor's International Scholarships 2022-2023

CIS will fund full-time tuition fees at the Overseas rate, as well as a UKRI level stipend and £5,000 RTSG. The scholarship will fund up to 3.5 years of PhD study.

Eligibility

All 'Overseas' fee paying students are eligible for this scholarship, meaning they must be deemed as an 'Overseas' fee payer by PG Admissions. Both new students and 1st year PhD students are eligible for the scholarship.

Application Deadlines

12 December 2022 (23:59pm GMT) Deadline for Admissions Applications to be submitted

14 December 2022 (23:59pm GMT) Deadline for Scholarship Applicants

The whole application process is a 2-step procedure; only successful PhD applicants (who have been issued an offer by us) will be considered for the CIS scholarships. Applicants are therefore advised to submit their applications (with all required supporting documents, e.g., certificates, English proficiency evidence, references etc.) at least 2 weeks before the stated deadline.



Applications to buy out UHCW clinician's time for a translational project would also be welcome. It is anticipated that 4-5 awards will be made.
- Breaking Translational Barriers Awards provide smaller awards of up to £10,000 to access bespoke external expertise and advice on the potential of the idea or technology and overcome well-defined barriers, for example engaging end users and networks, commissioning market research analyses and exploring routes to market to progress their research along the translational pipeline. UKRI is recruiting peer reviewers and grant panel members to assess applications to their prestigious Future Leaders Fellowships scheme (see below). Peer reviewers can be from any career stage, and this is a way to gain insight into how applications are assessed.

The UKRI Future Leaders Fellowship team are currently holding an open recruitment for both the FLF Peer Review College (PRC) and Talent Panel College (TPC). The PRC and TPC support the assessment process for future leaders spanning the entire remit of UKRI by providing valuable feedback to applicants, either by providing written reviews or participating in assessment panels.

For the PRC, applications are invited from eligible individuals at all career stages, including from early career researchers (ECRs), who can demonstrate that they meet the essential criteria for PRC membership. Reflecting the feedback we received from PGRs we will otherwise retain the online delivery of our workshops which you have said meets your needs and allows you the flexibility you require.


Research into LGBTQUIA+ attainment
