

FREE Cycle Training

The University has partnered with Sustrans as part of a Community Engagement Programme to provide a number of cycle training and skills sessions for the local communities hosted on main campus from November 2022 to March 2023. The training sessions are at two different levels: Learn to ride & Cycle skills.

Learn-to-ride sessions: These sessions are for complete beginners and will teach you balance and pedal action to get you riding and making sure you can start/stop independently.

Cycle skills: These sessions are for people who can already ride a bike and will help to increase your skills taught include riding at different speeds, observing hazards all around whilst stationary and moving, control of the bike in different circumstances, effective use of gears, and communication including signalling.
