Update from the SEM ED&I Forum (held 22 October)

The SEM ED&I Forum met for the first time this academic year on Tuesday 22 October. The Forum welcomed three new student representatives and Katie Berlin, who will be starting as the new Widening Participation Faculty Engagement Manager for FoSEM in November. Members of the Physics PG Committee were invited to talk about a more university-wide approach to period product supply, in line with the Athena Swan actions. A lab coats paper was also presented to the Forum for comment, outlining the availability of lab coats and other protective equipment in a range of sizes for different body shapes. Hilary Davies is a poet, critic, and translator. She has published four collections of poetry with Enitharmon Press, and has been a Royal Literary Fund Fellow at King's College, London (2012-6) and the British Library (2018-9). She is a former Chairman of the Poetry Society of Great Britain, a Fellow of the Temenos Academy and of the English Association. She was co-editor of Prophetic Witness: The Re-Imagining of the World (Routledge, 2020). In 2023 she was shortlisted for the Michael Marks Environmental Poet of the Year award for her pamphlet 'Its Birds Can Never Be Counted'. Davies is a member of the Power of the Word Project Advisory Board; and writes for The Tablet.

Emma Mason

Emma Mason is Professor of English and Comparative Literary Studies at the University of Warwick. Recent publications include a new edition of William Barnes' dialect poetry (Edinburgh University Press, 2025); and Christina Rossetti: Poetry, Ecology, Faith (Oxford University Press, 2018). She co-edits the Bloomsbury monograph series New Directions in Religion and Literature and is a member of the Power of the Word Project, Scholars of Religion and Literature Network, and the Catholic Women Writers Network. InReach10x | Professor Matthew Clayton - 13th of November 2024

On Wednesday the 13th of November 2024, the Institute for Advanced Study (IAS) will be joined by Professor Matthew Clayton from the Department of Politics and International Studies at Warwick University. Professor Clayton will be giving a talk on his forthcoming book, Independence for Children.

Independence for Children

The talk will briefly summarize the argument of Independence for Children. The book addresses the question of whether it is morally permissible for parents to enrol their children into controversial religious doctrines or ethical worldviews. It defends a radical alternative to dominant views of what parents are permitted to do to, with, or for their children: it's central idea—'anti-perfectionist parenting'—asserts that it is often morally impermissible for parents to engage in religious and other kinds of ethical enrolment.

Professor Clayton will be giving a seminar as part of the InReach10x Series on **Wednesday the 13th of November 2024, from 13.00 - 14.00 in C0.02, IAS Seminar Room**

Key Changes:

- Revised Timelines: We've adjusted our course approval timelines to align with CMA regulations, ensuring a timely and transparent process.
- Enhanced Student Engagement: We're committed to keeping students informed about curriculum changes that may affect them. We'll provide clear guidance on how to engage with students after "material information" is published.
- Strategic Approval Stage: To facilitate early feedback and ensure the viability of new course proposals, we've introduced a Strategic Approval stage. This will allow for a strategy-informed approach to course development.

The course approvals team is finalising the implementation plan and will be sharing more details with you soon. We'll also be making use of various communication channels, including Faculty-level communications, HoDs & DAs newsletters, and the EPQ Administrators Forum, to ensure that everyone has access to the necessary information. Warwick Food and Drink Vouchers

Hello,

The new Warwick Food & Drink on-line booking system allows department to control their cost code spend, as the Warwick Voucher system allows departments to specify how much each person can spend on a cost code within the Warwick Food & Drink system.

This change has been made to help streamline the ordering process and to empower departments to control their own budgets and spend.

Currently the Warwick Food & Drink system allows customers to enter their costs codes if none have been setup in Warwick Vouchers – this option will be removed soon.

1 - To allocate a cost code to an individual, select the permissions option when viewing your voucher scheme:



2 - This gives you the option to add or edit existing account managers or creators. For each cost code you can specify the maximum spend for Warwick Food & Drink, this defaults to £0.00:



3 - Once this is done, any cost codes that have been allocated a spend will be available for that person to select at checkout.
