## Up to £1000 available to support local collaborative projects involving Coventry City Council and focused on the wider determinants of health

As part of the <u>Coventry Health Determinants Research Collaboration</u>, the Universities of Warwick and Coventry have come together to invite policymakers and researchers to apply for up to 1k funding. This funding is available to support ongoing conversations and collaborations focused on integrating research into areas of the wider determinants of health. Examples include, but are not limited to housing, transport, education, and access to green spaces. Groups should have a long-term vision to apply for research funding.

Applications must include at least one Coventry City Council policymaker, at least one University of Warwick and/or Coventry University researcher, and, where possible, at least one third-sector organisation.

There will be two webinars where you can learn more and ask questions about the funding and the process. We recommend joining one before completing the application with your collaboration.

Dear Warwick University Psychology Department,

I am a registered supervisor currently working with one of your students Sheryl Root.

I wonder if I can let you know about my forthcoming book, 20 Ways to Break Free from Trauma, published by Jessica Kingsley, which has been endorsed by Sir Terry Waite and Alastair Campbell. I hope it will be a useful resource for students who may be working with vulnerable clients suffering trauma in its various facets. In the book, I present the breadth of trauma in 20 chapters in an attempt to distil the different trauma responses and make them understandable, as well as offer hope and ways through. The book is written in an approachable style and accessible language. It includes practical exercises and poems which reflect the spectrum of trauma. The style is 'bite sized chunks' to mitigate overwhelm. It is written for a general audience, for those with trauma who might recognise within its pages themselves or someone they are supporting.

In addition, I wonder if any of your staff or clients might be interested to attend a free **event on trauma at the Banbury Therapy Group on Saturday 23 November 5pm-7pm.** I will be in conversation with Alaa Safi, Founder of Counselling Without Borders and Rachel Young, Director and Co-Founder of the Banbury Therapy Group about trauma, drawing on the ideas of the book, what trauma is, how responses to overwhelming life situations show up in our minds and bodies and what we can do to move on and heal, post trauma. **Any students would be welcome to attend, all that is needed is to ring the number below on the flyer or email myself for more information.**
