We just want to clarify a few things:

What needs to be done now/when you arrive in country

COMPLETING SHORT ONLINE FORM WITHIN 24 HOURS OF ARRIVAL IN YOUR HOST COUNTRY

• For insurance purposes of us knowing where students are, you are required to confirm that you have arrived in-country within 48 hours of arrival. <u>This is a short online form</u>.

FUNDING QUERIES

Warwick Mobility Bursary/Turing Scheme

• We have not yet opened up funding applications. We will contact you in October when we are in a position to do so. At that point you will be given instructions on what you need to submit to us in order for your funding application to be processed. Until we receive further student data we are not in a position to confirm who will receive Warwick Mobility Bursary or Turing Scheme funding. Once we have this data we will contact students to confirm. Students were advised at pre-departure events to not expect to receive funds before November.

Travel Grant or student loan query through Student Finance England/Scotland/Wales

• If you are applying for a travel grant through one of the external Student Finance organisations, then follow their instructions and speak with them directly. We sent a list to Student Finance England of all students undertaking year abroad back in May. This half-day hybrid workshop led by Dr Nick Tierney will give an introduction to <u>Quarto</u>, an open-source scientific and technical publishing system.
