In addition to supporting DR@W, the GRP does a lot more to raise the profile of Warwick's behavioural science community both locally, nationally and internationally.

The GRP funds behavioural science events throughout the year including both <u>DR@W</u> and the <u>SONA pool</u> and we think that this introductory session will be of particular value to new members of research staff, including PhD students, who may be unaware of the GRP, where DR@W fits into the overall picture and the potential research funding opportunities that the GRP may offer them.

Warwick is a Stonewall Diversity Champion and has submitted to the <u>UK Workplace Equality Index</u> for a number of years, achieving **Gold** in 2022. Beyond the accreditation, the real value lies in how we work on our feedback. Our Stonewall Self-Assessment Team is a friendly space for members across the University (LGBTQUA+ and Allies) to discuss and evaluate our progress. With our collective knowledge we can consider priority areas where we can make continuous improvement for Warwick's LGBTQUA+ community in 2022/23 and beyond.

Over the last few years much work has already been undertaken to progress LGBTQUIA+ inclusion at Warwick, including:

- Scrutinized all HR policies to ensure the language is gender neutral and does not discriminate against any individual or groups of individuals due to their sexual orientation or gender identity.
- Introduced the <u>Rainbow Taskforce</u>, which is co-chaired by one Academic staff member, one Professional Services staff member, and one student representative. Representatives from Warwick Students' Union (SU), the SU Pride Society, and the SU's Trans and LGBTQUIA+ Officers also attend. Co-Chairs provide a verbal update to the Provost at the Social Inclusion Committee.
- Relaunch of the Rainbow Allies Programme in May 2021.
- Worked with HR to include an inclusive statement to prospective staff to enable staff to provide pronouns and preferred name prior to interview.
- Produced the LGBTQUIA+ Getting Started Resource.
- Worked closely with The Queering University Programme to produce a <u>Trans Web</u> <u>Portal</u>
- Developed the <u>Pronouns: Let's Get it Right</u> campaign.
- Spearheaded extensive works across campus to re-sign all gendered single occupancy toilets to be labelled simply as 'toilet'.
