We want to focus this award on students who would be unable to undertake an internship without this support. The closing date is 1st May. There is an award for best psychology project as well as bursaries to support conference participation. Determining post-PhD career options is a challenge for many Psychology PhD graduates. Here I provide a comprehensive overview of the diverse career trajectories available to graduates. Drawing from interviews with 53 PhD graduates conducted as part of the two-volume Academia and the World Beyond book series. Specifically, a hierarchical qualitative classification was conducted to categorise and characterise potential career paths. The findings reveal a spectrum of opportunities, from traditional academic roles to "academic adjacent" and "skill-transfer" careers. This work underscores the versatility of Psychology doctoral training, providing skills that can support a wide array of career possibilities. The results serve as a guide for current and prospective PhD students—and their mentors, emphasising the variety of professional contexts where doctoral training is beneficial.

The talk will take place on **Tuesday 21st May 2024, from 11.30am - 1.00pm, in Room 0.03 in the Humanities building.**

There will also be a free social lunch with the speaker afterwards in the WBS cafe, from 1.00pm - 2.00pm.
