I am LaiLeng, the lead for work experience student services for Internships, Placements and Work Experience (IPWE) Team, as part of Student Opportunity.

It has been a successful year since we launched WorkReady in Oct 2023, a toolkit developed specifically to support Warwick students in their work experience journey. Thank you to all who have been helping to shape and promote it. Please find below a summary of what WorkReady is, its engagement with students, and the complementary work experience student services for the last academic year 2023-2024.

WorkReady (accessible via warwick.ac.uk/WorkReady)...

- is a one-stop platform that empowers students with the knowledge and skills to access onthe-job training, enhancing their employability and work-readiness for graduate jobs.
- supports students before, during and after their work experience journey as follows, although students can dip in and out to address their needs:
 - Getting Started stage (finding work experience)
 - o Getting Ready stage (preparing for and making the most of secured experience)
 - Getting Ahead stage (reflecting on completed work experience and applying learning gains to future career plan).
- consolidates IPWE's work experience student services, and related resources, activities, opportunities and training offered by Student Opportunity, the wider University and the external market.
- was promoted at 14 central and in-department events, and via multi-media marketing channels including supporting 1200+ students signed up to WorkReady and IPWE's Moodle courses.
- attracted 6784 total views (approximately 5631 distinct views) to the landing page in the first academic year (01 Oct 23 to 30 June 2024) 69% of viewers were interested in Getting Started stage (finding work experience).
- facilitated the work experience bursary for self-sourced unpaid work experience providing 483
 bursaries totalling £189300.
- promoted awareness of the new Warwick Advance Internship Programme, culminating in more than 250 student members from widening participation backgrounds.

Blended learning work experience provisions...

- delivered 27 work experience workshops (63% in-person: 37% online) to more than 330 students.
- 87.5% of attendees rated the workshops at 4 or 5 (highly recommended).
- generated positive feedback (which means that our provision is on track) including:

 "I wanted to take a moment to thank you for all the insightful sessions you've led. They have been incredibly valuable, and I've learned a great deal from them. In particular, the networking session, where we practiced handshakes, elevator pitches, and the importance of a smile, had a profound impact on me. Your final advice about how a smile can take us far truly resonated with me." PGT student of WMG.
