Dear all,

Please see the advert for <u>the third and final MRC IAA call</u> directly below my email signature (<u>linked here</u>). Please disseminate this through departmental channels and to any colleagues you believe would be interested. The programme is targeted towards medical/healthcare projects which are past early proof of concept stage.

The deadline for this  $8^{th}$  March 2024, with a rapid decision made and the resulting stage 1 cohort anticipated to start w/c  $18^{th}$  March.

The stage 1 application is light-touch and has a high success rate (>75%). Conversion to stage 2 after successful pitching is also high (>50%), with feedback provided by the external expert stage 2 panel proving to be invaluable for pathfinding the right approach to translation.



Dear Colleagues,

Season's greetings! We are delighted to announce that the University of Warwick's third MRC IAA call is now open for applications with a deadline of **8th March 2024**. This is anticipated to be the **final call for the MRC IAA**.

The primary aim of this IAA is to speed up the transition from discovery research to translation. This will typically be achieved through clinical or industrial translation, or spin-out formation. Past successful stage 1 applications have been from WMG, Chemistry, Physics, Psychology and WMS, and applications from all departments are welcome.

Applying for stage 1 is designed to be quick and easy, with the application form accessible here: https://warwick.ac.uk/fac/sci/med/mrciaa/.

All awards follow a two-stage process:

- Stage 1: Market research and value proposition development, working with Warwick Innovations through an exciting entrepreneurship programme. Stage 1 releases £5,000 to enable researcher buy-out, with an early career researcher expected to lead on this aspect.
- Stage 2: Pitch a milestone-based project of up to £45,000 (direct costs) to an expert panel based on learnings from Stage 1. Past panels have been attended by leading life sciences VC and NHS technology transfer professionals, providing deep and valuable insights into the future of your technology.

Applications under a broad health sciences or medical remit are encouraged,

and projects do not have to be commercially leaning but should involve provision of mature technology or services. We expect stage 2 pitches to have a 50% or greater success rate.


