Chiara De Gregorio – Research Fellow

Hi all, I'm Chiara. I am a Post doctoral researcher under the fellowship "The Ape and the First Word", and I just joined the APE TANK lab of Prof. Adriano Lameira. I started my 2-year fellowship at the beginning of February. I obtained my PhD in Biology and Applied Biotechnologies at the University of Torino (Italy), where I also did a post-doc on the rhythmic structure of lemurs' songs. I am an ethologist/primatologist, and my research has manly focused on vocal communication in non-human primates, mostly in their natural habitat. I investigated turn-taking abilities, rhythmic features, linguistic laws, duetting behaviour in lemurs, titi monkeys, baboons, gibbons. Here, my aim is to investigate great apes' vocal behaviour to unravel the biological roots of our language, musicality, and rhythm. I am very excited to start this research journey!
